The speaker for the evening was Joshua Rosales, Director of Middle Tennessee and Rutherford County Latinos For Tennessee. Nashville, TN -- Every year, the Tennessee Federation of Republican Women (TFRW) invites all club members from across the state to visit the state legislature. TFRW President Sharon Boreing convened the more than **300 women** in the House of Representatives chamber to hear speakers followed by a luncheon and speakers at the Doubletree Hotel Downtown Nashville. State Senator Steve Southerland, Representative Jeremy Faison, Representative Rick Eldridge, Representative Mary Littleton, and Speaker of the House Cameron Sexton all addressed the group while in chamber. Club members gathered on the steps of the Capitol for a group photograph.

At the luncheon that followed, GOP Chair Scott Golden spoke on the Republican win in 2024 and its importance for the Nation. The keynote speaker was US Senator Bill Hagerty who addressed the group on the effects of the border crisis.

School Board Zone 6: Butch Vaughn defeated Chase Williams. Former President Donald J. Trump is the Presumptive Presidential Republican nominee.

Early voting results will be tallied after closing of the polls at 7:00 p.m. on election night.

Remember to exercise your privilege to vote in the elections noted below:

August 1, 2024 - State & Federal Primary, Rutherford County General Election and Murfreesboro City Municipal elections to elect Murfreesboro's governing body, Mayor and City Council for 4-year staggered terms. The Mayor and City Council are chosen at large in nonpartisan elections held in August of even numbered years. Last day to register: July 2, 2024 Absentee by mail voting period: May 3, 2024 through July 25, 2024 Early voting period: July 12, 2024 through July 27, 2024

November 5, 2024 - State and Federal General Election Last day to register: October 7, 2024 Absentee by mail voting period: August 7, 2024 through October 29, 2024 Early voting period: October 16, 2024 through October 31, 2024

LEGISLATIVE NEWSLETTER TENNESSEE FEDERATION OF REPUBLICAN WOMEN (<u>TFRW</u>)


The last half of the 113th Tennessee General Assembly reconvened on January 9, 2024. Approximately 3000 bills have been filed in this 2023-24 session. Some have made it through the process and have been signed into law. Some have fallen by the wayside. Some will be re-introduced in the next session. **This report includes a sampling of bills that are currently in the process.**

- Under the heading Environmental Preservation, a bill (HB 2063/SB 2691) is progressing that seeks to ban weather modification experimentation in the skies over Tennessee. This would include solar radiation modification, stratospheric aerosol injection and other related activities. Cloud seeding is one example of this type of activity that has been recognized as occurring since the 1960's. These activities result in harms to human health, water quality and soil viability, to name a few. Seven other states are currently considering similar legislation. Weather modification experimentation is currently legal in Tennessee.
- One of the most-talked-about pieces of legislation this year is being referred to as the school voucher bill (HB1183/SB0503). This legislation would expand the program that was put in place last year but limited to three counties that allowed parents of students who were accepted into the program to receive and use state funds to attend a school of their choosing. The current bill would expand this to 20,000 students across the state this year and further expand it in the future. There are many unanswered questions and concerns on both sides of the issue, more than space allows here to mention. Right now, the House bill is much more detailed than the Senate bill so there is a long way to go to bring these together.
- At the federal level, Senator Bill Hagerty sponsored the Equal Representation Act (S.3649), legislation intended to ensure that only legal US citizens are factored into the count for the purpose of congressional apportionment, which also determines the number of electoral votes each state has. As people continue to leave Democrat-run cities, Democrats are back-filling the loss of residents with illegal immigrants so that they do not lose their seats in Congress or their electoral votes for president. One can see how Democrat-run states are also seeking to inflate their populations by using the sanctuary designation for their states or selected cities, which could then result in an increase of their political power. If approved, this legislation would require a citizenship question be included on the census form, resulting in the ability to obtain the number of legal citizens for the purpose of redistricting. Collection of this information will also provide greater understanding of the U.S. population by providing more accurate numbers and percentages of citizens and non-citizens. Senator Marsha Blackburn is a co-sponsor on this bill.

We have a great resource in our state's user-friendly website to follow activity of the General Assembly. With just a little practice to get familiar with the options it provides, we can learn about our legislators, see what bills they sponsor or cosponsor, read a summary or read the actual language of the bill (which I recommend), follow committee calendars and agendas, and watch videos of the House, Senate and committee sessions plus more. <u>THIS LINK</u> is the door to all of these capabilities.

Let's remember to pray for our legislators. They are dealing with weighty and complex matters that require their very best efforts and energy. Prayer is one of the best ways we can support them.
