Commissioner Beverly also discussed Public Safety, Middle Point Landfill, hiring a lobbyist, and impact fees.


He concluded the presentation by entertaining questions from the crowd.

The Barbara McAndrew IRIS Fund

History

In November of 1997, the Tennessee Federation of Republican Women (TFRW) Board of Directors established a Political Action Committee (PAC) to provide Republicans seeking election to Tennessee's General Assembly with financial assistance.

In honor of the effective and diligent efforts of outgoing TFRW President Barbara McAndrew, the PAC was called the Barbara McAndrew Iris Fund. Barbara McAndrew served on the Iris Fund Committee until her death in 2011.

The Iris Fund is managed by a committee of the TFRW. The committee is composed of six members, two from each grand division of the state of Tennessee. The committee works closely with the Tennessee Republican Party and has sole responsibility for distributing monies.

TFRW Clubs Contributions and Participation

Each TFRW affiliated club is expected to contribute to the Barbara McAndrew Iris Fund annually.

In the even numbered years, club representatives from across the state gather in Nashville for the Iris Fund Luncheon or Brunch after the legislative session has ended. Clubs may also be asked for an auction item or monetary donation for this luncheon. In the odd numbered years at the TNFRW Biennial Convention, TFRW affiliated clubs who have submitted their checks to the Iris Fund Treasurer will be listed in the Convention Program.

Checks are presented in the even numbered years to the Republican State Legislative candidates who have won the August State Primary Election.

Every election cycle since the Iris Fund was established, TFRW has contributed to provide financial support toward electing Republicans to the Tennessee House of Representatives and Senate.



Legislation and Research Report

TFRW Spring Board Meeting April 27, 2024



Enacts the "Restoring State Sovereignty Through Nullification Act," which establishes processes by which the general assembly may nullify an unconstitutional federal statute, regulation, agency order or executive order. (HB 2795/SB 2775 Hulsey-Bowling) Sent to summer study

Defines food that contains a vaccine or vaccine material as a drug for purposes for the Tennessee Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act. (HB 1894/SB 1903 Cepicky-Hensley) Transmitted to Governor for action.

Prohibits the intentional injection, release, or dispersion, by any means, of chemicals, chemical compounds, substances, or apparatus within the borders of this state into the atmosphere with the express purpose of affecting temperature, weather, or the intensity of the sunlight (HB 2063/SB 2691 Fritts – Southerland) Signed by Governor

"School voucher bill" (HB1183/SB0503 Lamberth-Johnson) Failed

Authorizes a faculty or staff member of a school to carry a concealed handgun on school grounds subject to certain conditions, including obtaining an enhanced handgun carry permit and completing annual training. (HB1202/SB 1325 Williams-Bailey) Signed by Governor

Requires, rather than authorizes, law enforcement agencies to communicate with the appropriate federal official regarding the immigration status of any individual, including reporting knowledge that a particular alien is not lawfully present in the United States or otherwise cooperate with the appropriate federal official in the identification apprehension, detention, or removal of aliens not lawfully present in the United States. (HB2124/SB2576 Grills-Taylor) Signed by Governor

Requires the coordinator of elections to compare the statewide voter registration database with those of other relevant state agencies and county records when compiling information to distribute to the county elections commissions for purposes of purging voters who have moved; requires the coordinator of elections to compare the statewide voter registration database with the department of safety database to ensure non-US citizens are not registered to vote in this state. (HB0835/SB0137 Richey-Hensley) Transmitted to Governor for action

Constitutional Conventions – Makes application to Congress for the purpose of calling an Article V convention to propose an amendment to the US Constitution to set a limit on the number of terms to which a person may be elected as a member of the congress of the United States. (HJR 0005 Todd) Signed by Governor
